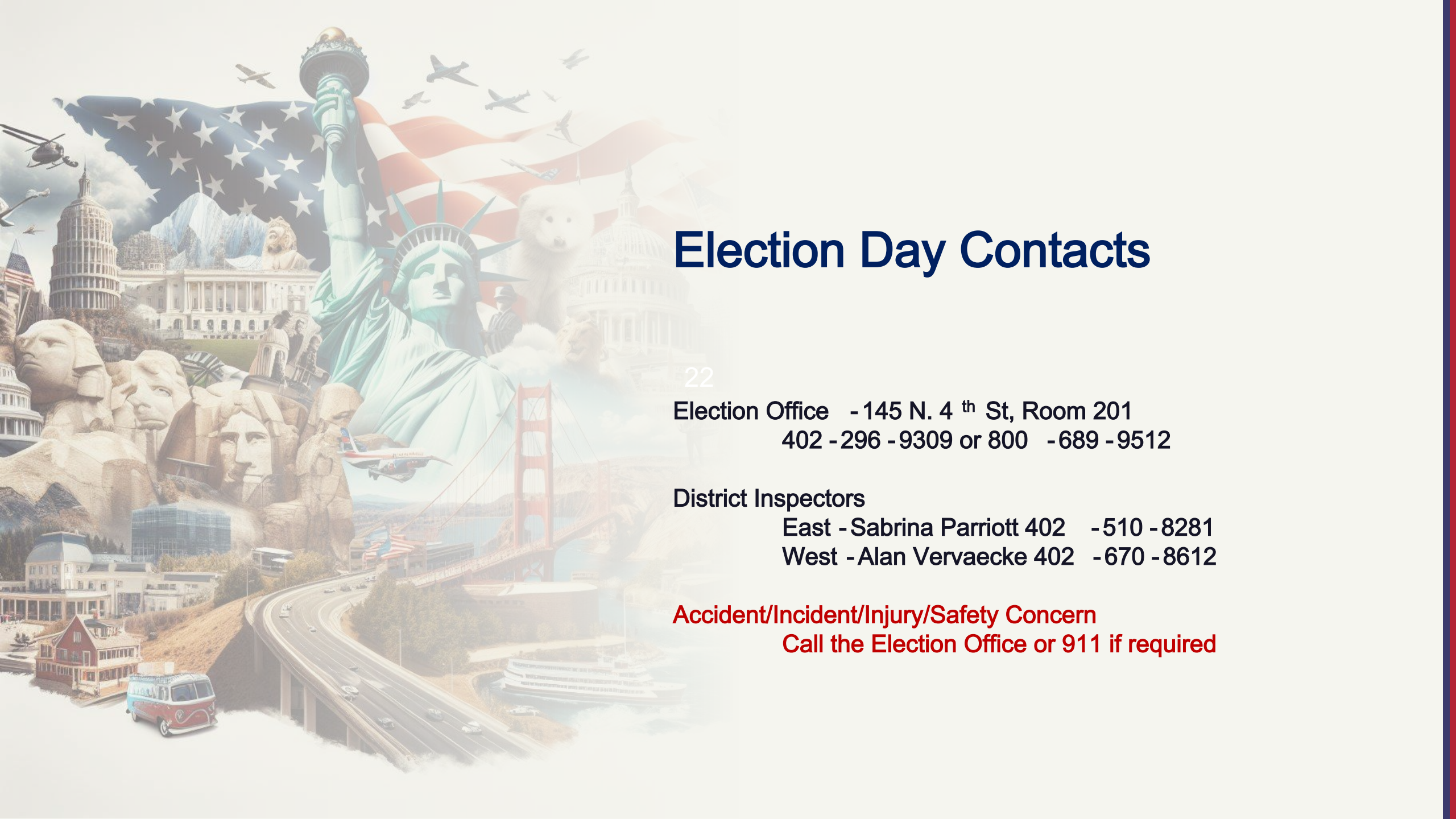

Compensation

- If you complete training and return your quiz, you will be paid \$20.00
- Clerks/Judges receive \$15.00 per hour
- Inspectors receive \$18.00 per hour
- Mileage only for supply pick up and drop off (District and Precinct Inspectors)
- It takes approx. 4 -6 weeks for checks to be mailed

Before Election Day

- Notify Employer of election duty immediately (§32-241)
- Complete training (§32-235)
- Vote Early (in Election office or by mail, if you are not working in your home precinct)
- If you are a Clerk/Judge and have not heard from your Precinct Inspector prior to the training date, please contact the Election Office
- Precinct and District Inspectors will pick up their supplies/ballots the day before the election

Time off for Election Day

According to Nebraska State Statute (32-241), no employee shall be subject to:

- Discharge from employment
- Loss of pay
- Loss of sick leave
- Loss of vacation time
- Threat of any action or penalty
- Any other form of penalty

❖ Any issues regarding employment protection, please immediately reach out to our office or the Nebraska Secretary of State

Nebraska does have employee protection rights for those individuals working on elections, our office can send a letter to employers if they have any issues with your request for time off.

General Information

Primary Election: First Tuesday after the second Monday in May (§32-401)

Working Hours: 7:00 a.m. – 8:30 p.m. (approx.)

Polls Open: 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. (§32-908)

Appointment Tenure: 2 Years (§32-231; §32-236)

The Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, May 12, 2026

- ❖ *Special Elections which require polling sites to be open seldom occur; however, be aware they may happen (i.e., 2022 Congressional District 1 Special Election)*

Conduct at the Polls

Treat all voters with:

- Kindness
- Courtesy
- Dignity
- Respect

- Refrain from excessive and loud visiting with voters and among yourselves
- DO NOT engage in any political conversations while conducting the election
- **Do not have food or beverages in open view of the voters (By the Clerk's books or BALLOTS)**
- Be professional and business like
- Be prepared to deal with any situation Ex: Voter with campaign buttons, shirts

Because of political advertisements

- No TV's
- No Radio's allowed

Where do I Vote?

- You will get voter's that are not sure where they are supposed to vote.
- They may have moved and not updated with the Election Office.
- Refer them to Voter Check to find out, look it up for them or call the Election Office.
- It might be best to check both, their Name (to make sure they are registered in Cass County) and Address (to make sure they vote in the correct precinct).

Where do I vote?


Each voter must cast their ballot at their assigned polling place.



Where do I Vote?


- Name-Enter First & Last Name and Cass, Click on Look Up



NO Campaign Material Allowed in Polling Facility

If someone has any Material that pertains to a Candidate that is **ON THE BALLOT**, it needs to be removed from the polling facility.

With the large volume of campaign literature sent to the public you will need to occasionally check the polling facility and in the voting booths for any media or campaign literature that has been left behind.

NO CAMPAIGN MATERIALS ALLOWED

This material includes but is not limited to:

- Buttons
- Hats
- Pins
- T-Shirts
- Literature
- Posters
- Signs

Any material that advertises a candidate or political party is not allowed inside the polling place or within 200 feet of any entrance to the polling place. Exceptions include poll watcher and candidate badges.

Media



- **ONLY THE PRECINCT INSPECTOR** may answer media questions from the media regarding the number of people who have voted.
- TV Cameras ARE allowed as long as they're not disturbing the voters or the voting process.
- They should get permission from the individuals before filming them.
- Press representatives should contact the Election Commission as well as the judge of election or another poll worker at the site of their plans. Press representatives should have their credentials available.
- Press representatives are not to be disruptive at the polling place. As with all others, members of the media are prohibited from wearing or displaying campaign materials in the polling place.
- With regard to photography (including video) official ballots either blank or voted should not be photographed. A photo of the sample ballot may be an appropriate substitute.
- The photographer should obtain permission from any voter, poll worker, or others that will appear in the photograph (or video). Voters are entitled to an expectation of privacy within their polling place.
- Any interviews with voters or videotaping standups or live broadcasts should be conducted outside the polling place so not to disrupt the voting process inside.

Exit Polls

Polling and interviews; prohibited acts; penalty. (Statute 32 - 1525)

No person shall conduct an exit poll, a public opinion poll, or any other interview with voters on election day seeking to determine voter preference within twenty feet of the entrance of any polling place or, if inside the polling place or building, within one hundred feet of any voting booth. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a Class V misdemeanor.

Election Worker Positions

- ALL Must be registered voters (§32-221) with the exception, of the Clerk
- District Inspector
 - Oversees the election process at multiple polling sites and enforces election law; acting as “an agent and deputy of the Election Commission” (§32-225); must be a registered voter; (for very experienced election workers - approx. 2+ election cycles).
- Precinct Inspector
 - Manages each polling site individually and the Judges and Clerks. Must be a registered voter (for experienced election workers - approx. 1-2 election cycles).
- Clerk of the Election (§32-913)
 - Responsible for maintaining the Alphabetical Rosters (Black Book) and List of Voters (Red Book).
 - May be 16 or 17 years of age at minimum. (§32-223)
- Judge of the Election
 - Responsible for issuing and receiving the ballots at each polling site.

District Inspectors

- Will go to their assigned precincts and check to see how everything is going and answer any questions you might have
- Will make sure ExpressVote machines are set up and ALL required materials are displayed
- Will have extra supplies if you are running low on anything
- Will transport ballot boxes and supplies to the election office after the polls close

All precincts listed in **BLACK**; the Precinct Inspector will deliver their ballots and supplies back to the election office.

All precincts listed in **RED**; the Precinct Inspector will deliver their ballots and supplies to the Extension Office at the Cass County Fair Grounds, 8400 144th St, Weeping Water. Both District Inspectors will meet at the Extension Office. They will record and transfer your ballots and supplies to the election office.

Precinct Inspectors

- Precinct Inspectors are a Deputy of the Election Commission
- Pick up and Return ballots and supplies
- Precinct Inspectors **MUST** contact election team members and polling site.
- Is responsible for the proper conduct of elections at their precinct
- Enforces the laws relating to elections
- Responsible for proper completion of Setup of ExpressVote Machine, Board Payroll, Oaths, Certifications, Provisional Voters and all other paperwork associated with the election
- Will assign job duties

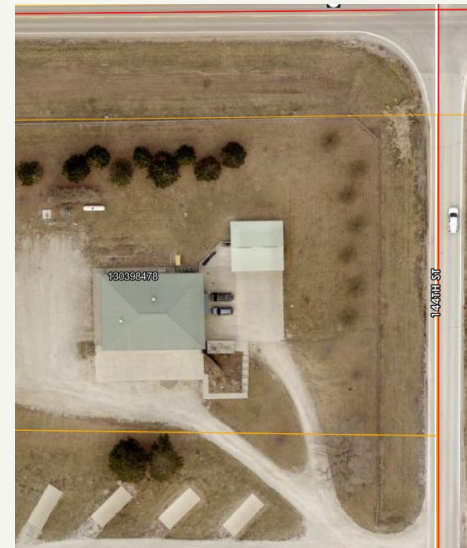

Nebraska Voter Cancellation Form

Opening the Polling Site



OPENING THE POLLING SITE

- ✓ Read and sign Oath of Election Board
- ✓ Fill out Payroll sheets
- ✓ Brief your workers of responsibilities
 - Remember to address
 - Conduct
 - Attitude-Etiquette
 - Sensitivity to cultural & disability
- ✓ Put on name badges
- ✓ **POST ALL REQUIRED INFORMATION**
 - Located behind the tab in the Accordion Folder labeled "Required Information to Post Per State Statute (32-902)"
- ✓ Post Misc. Signs
 - Located behind the tab in the Accordion Folder labeled "Misc. Signs to Post"
- ✓ Set Up Privacy Screens/Poll Booths
- ✓ Set Up Express Vote
- ✓ Cut off the seals and open the ballot box. Take the new seals out of the envelope and place the old seals in the envelope.
- ✓ Count ballots-Record numbers on Ballot Certification & Audit Report.
- ✓ Judges start initialing some of the ballots (2 sets of initials in **RED** ink)
- ✓ When 1st Voter comes in, publicly display ballot box to show it is empty. Put the envelope with the old seals in the ballot box. **Put 1 new seal on the zippers!!! The other seal will be used at the end of the night (put someplace safe)!!**
- ✓ Voting begins!!!
- ✓ Call the election office with any problems, discrepancies or concerns

SECURITY SEALS

- Verify that the security seal numbers recorded on the ballot certification & audit report all match.
 - If they do not match, call the election commission immediately
- Keep the new seals out of the envelope.
- After you cut the security seals from your ballot box place them inside this envelope.
- After you publicly display that the ballot box is empty place the envelope with the old seals inside the ballot box.
- Zip the ballot box and secure the ballot box with one of the new seals
- **THE BALLOT BOX WILL NOT BE OPENED AGAIN** until it reaches the election commission for tabulation.
- **AT THE END OF THE NIGHT** after your ballot certification & audit report and provisional voter sign in roster are in the ballot box. Close the flap and secure with the other seal.

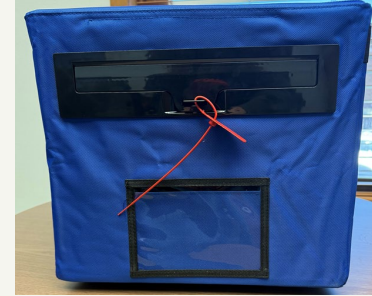
Ballot Box

- You will cut both red seals off and unzip the top of the ballot box. The padlock will not be removed!! (figures 1-3)
- Take the ballots, ballot certification & audit report and envelope out.
- Take the new seals out of the envelope and put the ones you cut off in the envelope.
- Place the envelope in the ballot box after publicly displaying the box is empty. (fig. 4)
- Zip the top of the ballot box closed and place one of the new seals through the zipper and secure it tight. (figure 5)
- The other seal will be put on after the polls close, so keep it someplace safe.
- Open the flap so you can deposit ballots. (figure 6)
- Once the polls are closed and you have put your ballot certification & audit report and the provisional ballot sign in roster into the ballot box, close the flap and secure it with the other seal. (figure 7)

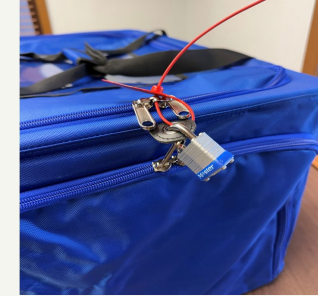

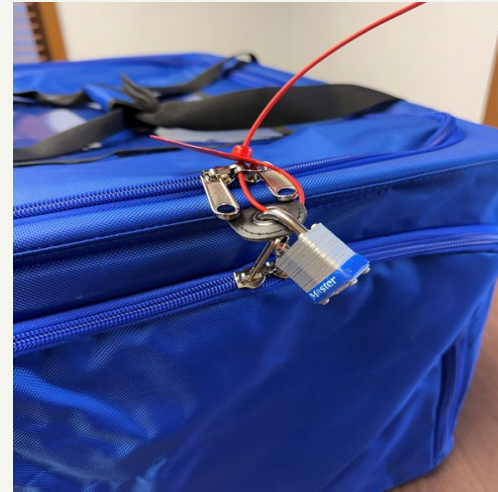

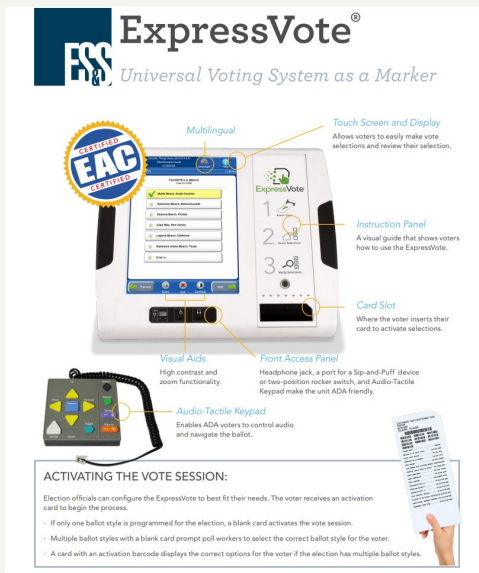
Verify the Seal Numbers on the ballot box match what is recorded on the Ballot Certification & Audit Report.

Remove ballots from the ballot box, count them and record the totals in the green "Received" column. These numbers should match the numbers in the "Issued" column. If they do not match, please count again to make sure numbers are accurate!

Record the total of all ballots, including the Express Vote ballots

Express Vote

- Express Vote machines **MUST** be setup!!
Even if you never get any requests to use it.
- Run a test ballot to ensure it is working properly. Write Test on the ballot and put in the Spoiled Envelope.



Express Vote Ballot

- This is what ballots for the ExpressVote look like
- Leave these ballots in the envelope until needed, they shouldn't be exposed to light for an extended period of time
- The only printing on the ExpressVote ballot is the initials box
- The initials box is on the back of the ballot
- **ONLY initial if a voter wants to use the ExpressVote machine**



Clerk 1 Instructions

Rosters (Black Book) Clerk 1-Primary Election

1. Smile, greet the voter.
2. Ask for the voter's name (even if you know them) and their address (do not provide the address to the voter). Look up the voter's name and address in the List of Eligible Voters Book (Black Book). **If name isn't found, go to WHAT IF's**
3. If name and address is correct proceed. **If not, go to WHAT IF's**
4. Ask for their ID. Compare picture to voter. If picture and name match proceed. **If no ID or picture doesn't resemble voter, get assistance from your Precinct Inspector. Go to WHAT IF's if name differs.**
5. Look at the VOTER STATUS, if the box is blank, proceed. **If not, go to WHAT IF's**
6. Determine what ballot(s) to be issued to the voter.
 - A. The ballot style is listed under BALLOT NUMBER.
 - B. Verify the voter's political party. If correct proceed. **If not, go to WHAT IF's**
 - C. Nonpartisan voters, have different options. Find out which option they want.
 - D. You will have "Party Cards". You will have "Split Cards" if you have multiple splits.
 - E. Give the voter the card(s) that match the ballot style/split. They will give the card(s) to the Judge to get their ballot(s).
7. Have the voter sign their name on the line that is corresponding to their printed name on the left (do not turn the book around for them to sign, signatures will be upside down in the book).
8. Clerk 2 will write the voters name in the **RED BOOK** and give you the line number, which you will write in the box (BOOK 2 LINE NO) on the same line with their name.

WHAT IF's

NAME

If their name isn't found, have them talk to the Precinct Inspector.

If their last name has changed, have them fill out a Provisional Ballot Application Form (Voter Registration Application Form), mark the box that says "Name Change" put in "Completed Forms" envelope and process as normal.

If the first name in the Roster and their ID differ (ex. James and Jim) you can process as normal. They might have their whole middle name on their ID, but the way the Rosters are set up, only the middle initial will be printed.

ADDRESS

If the address is different, they will have to go through the Provisional process. **DO NOT have them sign the black book!!!!**

VOTER STATUS

*EARLY VOTING BALLOT SENT VOTE PROVISIONALLY, they will have to go through the Provisional process.

***ADDRESS CONFIRMATION REQUIRED, have them verbally tell you their address again.**

***If it matches what is in the book, write your initials next to the address and proceed.**

***If it is different, they will have to go through the Provisional process. DO NOT have them sign the black book!!!!**

BALLOT NUMBER

If they want to vote a different party/split then what is listed, they will have to vote Provisionally.

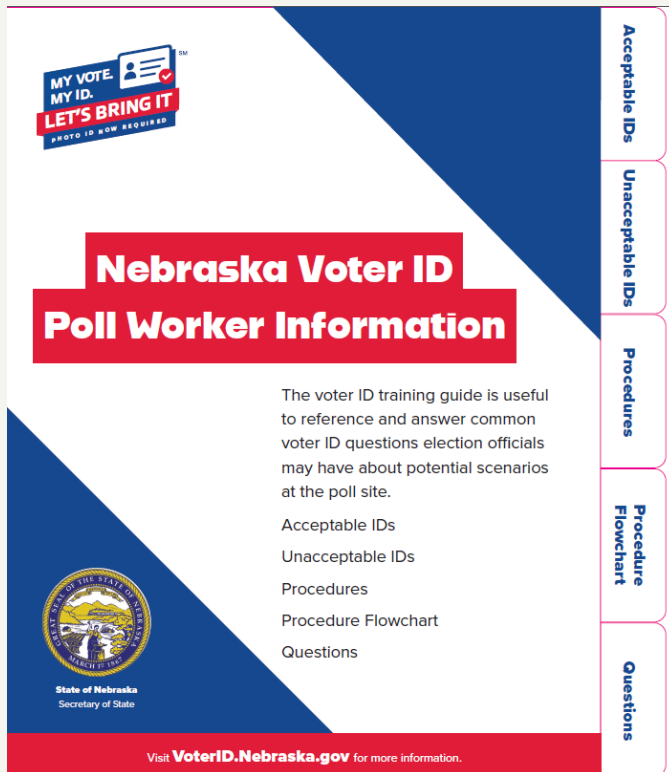

This flip book, located in the accordion folder, has the acceptable forms of ID that can be accepted!



EXAMPLES: Not limited to just these

Acceptable ID's

- **Nebraska** Driver's License, State ID, College ID & Political Subdivision ID
- United States Passport (Book or Card)
- Military ID

NOT Acceptable ID's

- Birth Certificate
- Social Security Card
- Out of State Driver's License or College ID
- Store Membership Card
- Bank Statement

1-A voter comes in, name is in roster, address is correct and they show ID. They vote normally. This is not a provisional or P-VIV voter.

2-A voter comes in, name isn't in roster, address is verified and they are in the correct precinct, they show their ID. They vote provisionally. The voter is entitled to vote a provisional ballot. The voter signs in register for provisional voters. The voter will then complete and sign a provisional ballot application form and envelope before voting. Then the voter will enclose the voted ballot in the provisional ballot envelope and select a PIN so they can access the website to find out whether the ballot was counted or rejected after the election.

3-A voter comes in, name is in roster, address is correct, they forgot/don't have ID.

The voter may go home to retrieve their photo ID, without signing in, and return with their ID prior to the close of polls to cast a regular ballot.

OR

- 1- The voter and poll worker fills out and signs the voter identification verification form (with RIC, if applicable).
- 2- Voter signs their name in the provisional sign in roster (not the black book).
- 3- Staple or tape the forms (voter identification form and RIC, if applicable) to the white envelope.
- 4- The voter's completed ballot goes into the white P-VIV envelope and placed in the ballot box.
- 5- Inform the voter they need to present an acceptable form of photo ID to their county election office, in person, on or before the Tuesday after the election for the ballot to be counted or the RIC voter that their signature will be verified by the county election official against their registration signature on file for the ballot to count. No other action is needed by the RIC voter.

4-A voter comes in, name isn't in roster, address is verified and they are in the correct precinct, they forgot/don't have ID.

The voter may go home to retrieve their photo ID, without signing in, and return with their ID. Once they come back they will vote provisionally.

OR

- 6- They vote provisionally **AND** the voter and poll worker fills out and signs the voter identification verification form (with RIC, if applicable).
- 1- Fold the provisional envelope (after it's completed) and place inside the white envelope.
- 2- Voter signs their name in the provisional sign in roster.
- 3- Staple or tape the forms (provisional ballot application, voter identification form and RIC, if applicable) to the white envelope.
- 4- The voter's completed ballot goes into the white P-VIV envelope and placed in the ballot box.
- 5- Inform the voter they need to present an acceptable form of photo ID to their county election office, in person, on or before the Tuesday after the election for the ballot to be counted or the RIC voter that their signature will be verified by the county election official against their registration signature on file for the ballot to count. No other action is needed by the RIC voter.

Inform voters they can check the status of their P-VIV and provisional ballot on the Secretary of State's website, ne.gov/go/votercheck, using the PIN they created on the outside of the envelope.

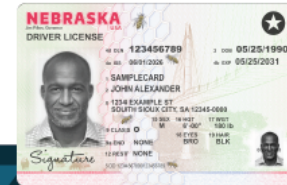

Nebraska has introduced a new generation of driver licenses and state identification cards designed to enhance security, durability, and ease of verification for businesses and institutions that rely on trusted identity credentials.

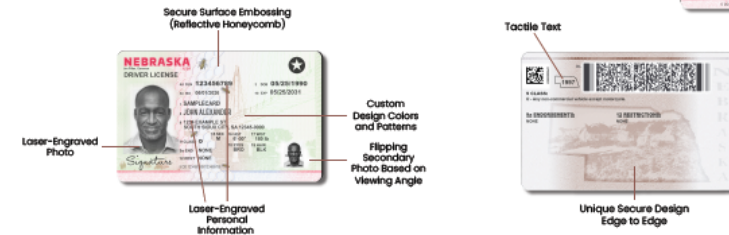

Nonpartisan Voters

- **THIS IS DIFFERENT THEN PREVIOUS YEARS.**
- Nonpartisan voters are not affiliated with a party, so they have different options.
- Each Nonpartisan voter will receive the Nonpartisan Ballot.
- Nonpartisan voters will **ONLY** receive **ONE** of the Nonpartisan-Partisan ballots (Ex. They can't get a Nonpartisan Republican ballot and a Nonpartisan Democratic ballot).
- You can't ask the voter if they would like to request a party's nonpartisan ballot as that could be considered electioneering. You can tell them they have options and show them the sample ballots and let them decide.

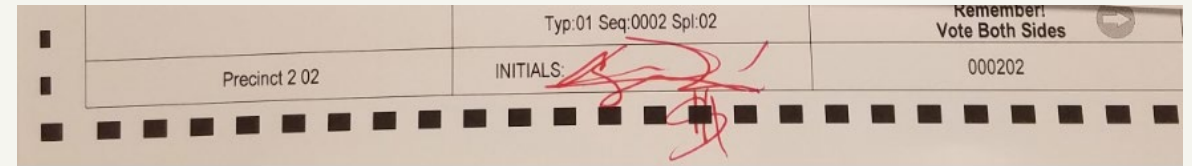

Ballots

Judges

1. Cut both seals off and unzip the ballot box. The padlock will not be removed. Take the ballots, ballot certification & audit report and envelope out. Take the new seals out of the envelope and put the ones you cut off in the envelope.
2. Initial ballots with **RED INK** (2 sets of initials are required). **DO NOT INITIAL ALL THE BALLOTS**. All initialed ballots that are not used at the end of the night will go in the Spoiled Ballot Envelope. **You will need to write SPOILED on them.**
3. When 1st voter comes in, publicly display ballot box to show it is empty. Place the envelope with the removed seals in the ballot box. Zip the ballot box and put on one of the **NEW SEALS!!!**
4. Provide the proper ballot and procedural instructions to the voter for casting a ballot.
5. Inspect voted ballots being returned for initials prior to placing ballot in the ballot box.
6. Oversee that ballots are not damaged in any way.
7. Any ballot that is spoiled by the voter, put in the "Spoiled Ballot Envelope" and keep a tally.
8. **DO NOT leave the ballots or ballot box unattended!!!**
9. After the last voter has voted:
 - Count all the Unused Ballots (this would only be the ballots with no initials) and record the numbers on the Ballot Certification & Audit Report. **Put all Unused Ballots in the Navy Blue Bag(s) Provided.**
 - Count all the Spoiled Ballots (this would include all initialed ballots that weren't given to a voter and the ballots that were spoiled by voters) and record the number on the Ballot Certification & Audit Report. **All Spoiled Ballots go in the Spoiled Ballot Envelope.**
10. Put the completed Ballot Certification & Audit Report and Provisional Sign In Roster in the ballot box. Close the flap and secure with the seal. |

- Once a ballot is initialed it becomes an *Official Ballot* and must be spoiled if not used.
- 2 sets of initials must be on every ballot. *This includes the ExpressVote sheets.*
- Only use **RED** ink in case writing gets into the timing track (the series of black boxes across the bottom). The machine will still tabulate the ballot.



- If a voter needs a new ballot due to a mistake, change of mind etc., they may receive up to 4 ballots. They must write **INVALID** or **VOID** across the ballot before receiving a new ballot. Place the invalid or void ballot in the Spoiled Ballot Envelope. Keep a tally for the spoiled ballots as you will need the total at the end of the night. (32 - 917)
- Ballot sleeves should be given to every voter.
- Voters wishing to vote without the use of a booth is permitted. Keep control of the situation at all times.

Primary Ballots

The Nonpartisan-Partisan Ballots will have a color bar code at the top. Make sure Nonpartisan Voters only receive a ballot(s) that has Nonpartisan at the top.

Judges Duties

Judge 1 Duties

- Use the card(s) given to you to select the voter's correct ballot
- Hand the initialed ballot, black pen and ballot sleeve to the voter
- Read the voting instructions to the voter (located in the accordion folder)

Judge 2 Duties

- When the voter completes their ballot, they must return the ballot to you
- You must inspect the ballot for the proper initials
- If the initials do not show only the voter can remove the ballot and replace it correctly so you can view the initials
- Place the ballot in the ballot box
- Take the pen from the voter and Thank them for voting!
- Stickers and web address information is available to the voters

Provisional Voters

Provisional Voters are voters whose voter registrations are not up to date in our data base.

- 4) Name is in the Black Book BUT Different Address, Different Precinct
- 5a) Name is in Black Book BUT Different Address, Same Precinct

- 7) General Presidential Election Only-Voters name is not in the List of Eligible Voters (Black Book).

"PROCESSING A PROVISIONAL VOTER"

- f. FULL Residential Address (Double check that it's in our County)
- g. Party Affiliation
- h. Applicant's Signature & Date

2. The Election Worker that is handling this needs to fill out the information in Step 2!!

3. If the voter wants to check the status of their ballot, they need to select a 5 digit pin number and write it in the boxes in Step 3. Give them the information (PIN) card that is in the folder.

4. Voter fills out the information and signs the Oath on the Provisional Envelope. **If not signed it will be rejected.**

5. **STAPLE** the Provisional Ballot Application Form to the outside of the envelope.

5. Have the voter sign their name in the Provisional Voter Sign-in Roster under "Signature of Voter". The rest of the line needs to be filled out by the Election Worker.

6. Print their name in the List of Voters (Red Book) and place an "X" in the Provisional Column.

7. Provide the correct ballot and a ballot sleeve. If you are unsure of the correct ballot split, call the election office.

8. Once completed have them slide their ballot into the Provisional Envelope, seal it and put in the ballot box.

What is RIC & P-VIV

New Definitions

Definitions of new terminology:

Reasonable Impediment Certification (RIC):

A RIC is a form that can be completed when a voter has a reasonable impediment preventing the voter from obtaining valid photographic identification:

- Inability to obtain an acceptable form of ID due to:
 - Disability or illness that prevents the voter from obtaining valid photographic identification.
 - Lack of birth certificate or other required documents and an inability to obtain a birth certificate or other required documents without significant difficulty or expense.
- Religious objection to being photographed.

Provisional Voter Identification Verification (P-VIV):

A P-VIV envelope is a provisional procedure for voters who do not present an acceptable form of photo ID at the poll site on election day. The voter completes their ballot, places it inside the P-VIV envelope, fills out and signs provisional voter's certification on the front of the envelope or attached form. The judge will place the P-VIV envelope in the ballot box. The voter presents an acceptable form of photo ID on or before the Tuesday after the election.

What to do if.....

- 1) A person asks to return an Early Voting Ballot.
- 2) A member of the media comes to the polling place.
- 3) A Watcher or Observer arrives at your precinct.
- 4) A voter with a disability is unable to enter the polling place.
- 5) A member of the public challenges a voter as unqualified.
- 6) Voted ballots being returned do not have 2 sets of initials on the ballot(s).
- 7) A voter enters the polling place and ask for assistance.
- 8) A voter says they made a mistake on their ballot.
- 9) A voter thinks they were given the wrong ballot.
- 10) A voter is taking too long in the booth or causing a disturbance.
- 11) Voter in List of Eligible Voters (Black Book) Moved out of Cass County.
- 12) How should the polling location be set up and/or what signs need to be posted?
- 13) We received the wrong ballots, clerk books and/or missing supplies. We are running out of ballots and/or supplies.
- 14) Emergency/Accident/Bomb Threat Procedures

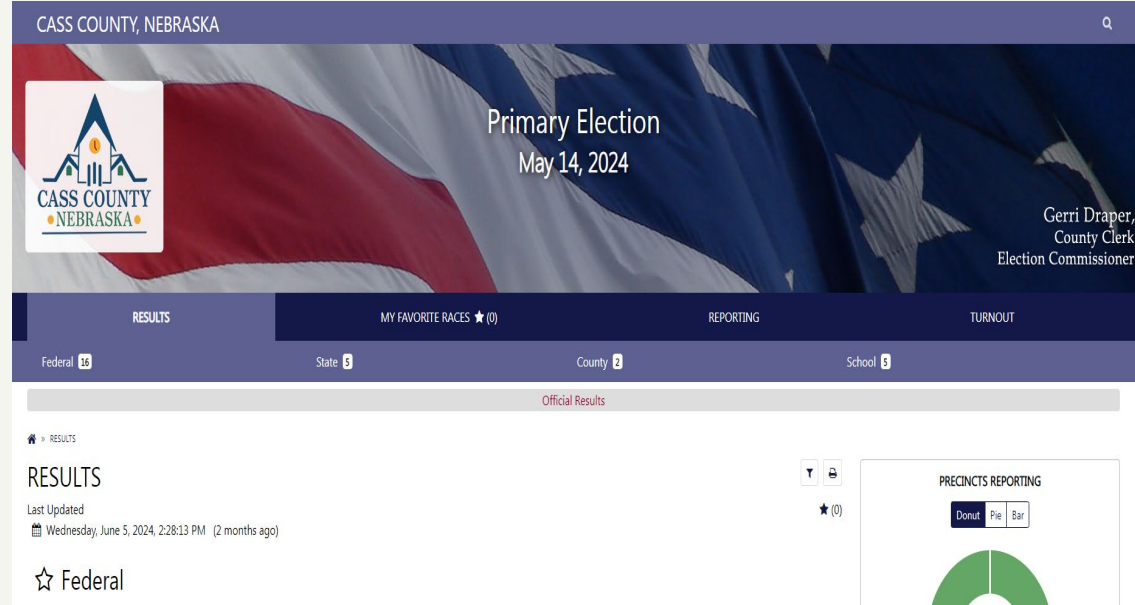
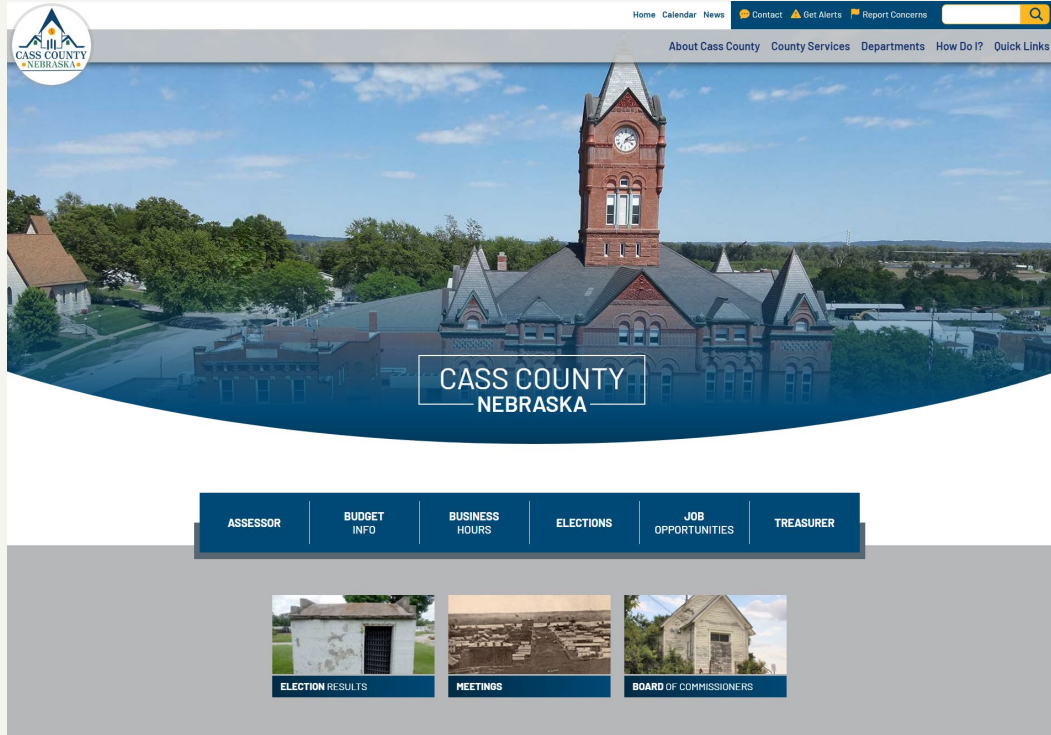


