### <u>First Item - Pending</u> Proposed Amendment-Amendment Z-2025-01 – Section 5.07 Agricultural District- Principal Permitted Uses

Add line J- including but not limited to electric, communications, rural and municipal water wells, water treatment plants and associated pipelines, gas, fuel or fertilizer lines, pumping stations, substations, terminal facilities, tanks and reservoirs.

Mueller made a motion to un-table this item, Crofoot seconded it. Unanimous roll call vote carried to approve motion. Mueller opened the discussion by updating the status. Commissioner DeGarmo has spoken with senators to set up a meeting in the future. That was all the updates at this time. Mueller made the motion to table this again, Church seconded it. Staben stated we are voting on something that hasn't happened yet. Mueller closed the hearing at 7:47 pm. Crofoot made a motion to table Felthousen seconded. it. A roll call vote followed with the following votes: Stroy—aye; Crofoot—aye; Mueller-aye; Felthousen-aye; Staben—aye Church-aye, Rayer-aye. Motion carried with a 7 to 0 vote.

Seventh Item-PROPOSED AMENDMENT Z-2025-04- Section 5.07- Agricultural District- Permitted Conditional Uses- Mueller asked Chappell to explain. Chappell stated changing from class one to medium and large livestock feeding operations. Mueller opened the hearing at 7:49pm closed at 7:50pm. Staben wanted to know why changing from four to five. Chappell stated he is following the Nebraska Department of Agriculture. Staben stated our regs are strict enough, we don't need to change. Mueller would like the final document before going forward Mueller made a motion to table Rayer seconded. A roll call vote followed with the following votes: Stroy—aye; Crofoot—aye; Mueller-aye; Felthousen-aye; Staben—aye Church-aye, Rayer-aye. Motion carried with a 7 to 0 vote.

Eighth Item-PROPOSED AMENDMENT Z-2025-05—Section 8.23- Livestock Feeding Operations Standards- Mueller Opened the hearing at 7:54 closed at 7:56 One person spoke. Mueller said he needed to see all the documents together before he could decide on it. Staben stated he doesn't think the small livestock feeding operation needs to be in there. Chappell stated he could omit that line. Mueller stated he would like all the documents finalized Mueller asked Stabin to work with Chappell A motion by Mueller to table. Crofoot seconded. A roll call vote followed with the following votes: Stroy—aye; Crofoot—aye; Mueller-aye; Felthousen-aye; Staben—aye Church-aye, Rayer-aye. Motion carried with a 7 to 0 vote.

Ninth Item- PROPOSED AMENDMENT Z-2025-06—Section 8.12- Contractor Registration-Mueller asked Chappell to explain the change Chappell stated it is clarifying what is already in the regulations. Mueller asked questions about liability, enforcement, cost. Chappell stated complaints will go in a file for public record. Mueller asked if Chappell had discussed this with the County Attorney. Chappell stated that information is already in the regulations. He did not change any of that. Mueller opened the hearing at 8:04pm. One person spoke and said the fee needs to be higher than \$50. Another person wanted to know what recourse the Contractor had against false claims. Mueller closed the hearing at 8:06pm. Mueller stated he still had questions about enforcement, tracking workman's comp insurance coverage, Church asked about reminders. Chappell stated there will be a quarterly newsletter that will be sent out to the contractors. Chappell stated the computer will do tracking. Any contractors who need permits through Cass County Zoning will be the Contractor list. Concerns were mentioned about permits/contractor registration not needed for roofers. Rayer stated he wants more time to go through it. Mueller asked Rayer to work with Chappell. A motion was made by Felthousen to table Church seconded. A voice vote held, with all in favor

Tenth Item- PROPOSED AMENDMENT Z-2025-07- Section 6.04- AA- Airport Approach Zone — Mueller asked Chappell to explain the change. Chappell stated he added one word. "Private". Mueller asked about the approach zone do. It effects power lines, towers. How are the existing powerline projects going to be affected by this. Projects are already in the works would not be affected. Mueller opened the hearing at 8:25pm and closed at 8:26pm. More discussion about the approach and what does that mean How many airports public and private. A motion was made by Mueller to table. Crofoot seconded. A roll call vote followed with the following votes: Stroy—aye; Crofoot—aye; Mueller-aye; Felthousen-aye; Staben—aye Church-aye, Rayer-aye. Motion carried with a 7 to 0 vote.

A motion was made by Mueller to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Crofoot. A voice vote followed with all present members voting aye. Meeting closed at 8:32 pm.
